


Laocoön *Laocoön*

This group was found in 1506 on the Palatine Hill in Rome and immediately identified as the Laocoön group from the Parthenon. The story is that during the Trojan War Laocoön, a priest of Apollo in the city of Troy, was killed by two serpents for warning the Greeks that they were coming. The two snakes were supposed to have been sent by Athena to punish Laocoön for interfering with the Trojan horse and for killing Priam's son, the future emperor of Rome, the deities of Rome, who had forbidden Laocoön from warning the Greeks. Such an interpretation is based on the fact that the Laocoön group was found in the ruins of the Temple of Apollo on the Palatine Hill in 1506. It is the only group of marble sculpture from the Parthenon that was found in Rome.
